"The Confident Hope" - Steve Minnich & Ed Redding - In the International Room The lessons will be drawn from Leviticus, Matthew, Luke, Romans, 2 Corinthians, Hebrews and 1 John. In our crazy world there is a dearth of hope. Sometimes it takes a tragedy or setback to force us to switch off the auto pilot of everyday life. When that happens the result can be an exposure of cracks in our beliefs and we begin to ask deeper questions of life. A times like this we need ample confident hope, and that comes exclusively in a continuing relationship with Jesus. Join us to see what Scripture says about confident hope.

"Death and Resurrection of the Messiah - Steve Svenson - In the Library Teacher and historian Ray Vander Laan brings together history, culture, and geography to illuminate the Gospels. The insights you gain will transform your reading of the Gospels and inspire a deeper faith commitment. Faith Lessons on the Death and Resurrection of the Messiah focuses on the last week of Jesus' life, his death and resurrection, and the Holy Spirit's visit on Pentecost.

Transition Update

- The Evangelical Congregational Church assigns Pastors on an annual basis. The next process for assignment does not begin until January 2022. This means we have a six-month window to evaluate our current state in order to make an informed decision come January.
- In the Meantime, leadership will be evaluating various pastoral roles, our own leadership make-up, and available means for compensation.
- The Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC) has already met with each pastor individually over the past month to get a big picture view of our overall ministry needs.
- Currently, the PRC is working on a three-phase plan that will help our leaders to understand and address the overall needs of the congregation.
- Phase One has been approved by the Ministry Council.

Phase One

- Pastor Jeff will assume the bulk of visitation duties and transition some preaching responsibilities to Pastor Stewart.
- Pastor Jeff will work with leaders to oversee targeted community outreach opportunities. He will also participate in all commission meetings.
- Pastor Stewart will be moved to 3/4 time in order to assist with visitation and other responsibilities.
- Pastor Stewart will assume a greater role in preaching to help balance the load, and delegate some aspects of youth and children's ministry.
